<Note> On Tuesdays/Thursdays, two types of garbage are collected one after another. Please do not dispose of garbage after 8:30 a.m., even if there is garbage left at the collection site, because one type of garbage may have already been collected.
(\*) Year-end/New Year Holidays: There is no collection on December 30 & 31, 2018, January 1, 2, & 3, 2019. However, extra garbage collection will be made for 'combustible garbage' on Sat. December 29, 2018. Regular schedule for garbage collection starts from Fri. January 4, 2019.

How to Dispose of Oversized Garbage

- 1. Make an appointment with the collection company which operates in your neighborhood. Appointment is in Japanese only. Please be careful not to dial a wrong number.
2. Purchase the Oversized Garbage Disposal Vouchers you need at a store (see list at right).
3. Attach the voucher(s) to your oversized garbage, and take the item(s) to the designated site by 8:30 a.m. on the appointed collection day.
4. The collection company will come to pick up the item.

Item Chart table columns A-C: Item, Description, Fee. Lists items like Accordian curtain, Air purifier, Audio equipment, Baby bath tub, etc.

Item Chart table columns G-S: Item, Description, Fee. Lists items like Flower stand, Futon, Galvanized sheet, Golf equipment, Heater, etc.

Item Chart table columns T-Z: Item, Description, Fee. Lists items like Shoji sliding door, Shopping trolley, Sink, Ski carrier, etc.

[Changes effective on and after April 1, 2014]
- Disposal fees are classified into three levels: 500 yen; 1,000 yen; and 1,500 yen.
- The face value of the new "Oversized Garbage Disposal Vouchers" are 500 yen each.

[About <Oversized Garbage Item Chart> (the chart on the left)]
1. Items which are listed in the <Oversized Garbage Item Chart> should meet either of the following conditions.

Size: Items which are too big to put in a 30-liter city designated bag.
Weight: Items which weigh 5 kg or more each.

2. In this chart, the word "Small" refers to items measuring 120 cm or less in its width, depth, and height. The word "Large" refers to items that do not fall under the category of "Small".

3. The disposal fee is for each oversized garbage item unless otherwise stated in the chart.

4. Disposal fee is 500 yen for up to 5 items within the same category in the small box below if the total weight is 15 kg or less.

\*The number of items you can combine at most is: As to futon, 2 pieces; as to other items, up to 4.

Category table: Category (\*1) and (\*2) with item examples and quantity limits.

Example of <combination of futon and blanket>
The <Oversized Garbage Item Chart> indicates, as you see, disposal fee is 500 yen for 3 futon or 5 blankets respectively.

[Collection of smartphones, mobile phones, PHSS, and main bodies of PCs at the Sakura City Hall Garbage Control Section]

As for collection of smartphones, mobile phones, PHSSs, tablet terminals, and PCs, collection by manufacturers is most recommended and encouraged. The city also may accept them at the Sakura City Hall (5th floor) Garbage Control Section when we determine we can properly handle them for recycling and disposal.

- Be sure to erase all personal data before disposal.
Please do not put mobile phones, PHSSs, and PCs in collection bins at Collection Points.
