SAKURA-NO-AKI-MATSURI



Sakura Autumn Festival 15:00 to 22:00 October 12 to October 14

The Sakura Autumn Festival is the biggest cultural event of our city. *Mikoshi* (lavishly decorated portable shrines) and *Dashi* (traditional festival floats), some of which are historical assets dating back to the *Edo* era (the samurai period), are carried or pulled by residents clad in happi coats in a procession along the designated route of

the old Sakura castle town. Please check the schedule below. **Fri. October 12:** *Oh-mikoshi* (A great portable shrine) comes out from *Makata-Jinja Shrine* at about 15:00. *Dashi* (Parade


Float) held by each town is carried around the old part of Sakura City, surrounded by dancing people from each town. **Sat. October 13:** All the *Dashis* move to the event site of the festival and will make a procession one after another along the *Shin-machi* street.

Sun. October 14: Dashis will be carried around the festival site. Oh-mikoshi returns into Makata-Jinja Shrine at about 21:30.

Many vendors will be setting up stalls selling food and drinks, souvenirs and local merchandise, games and so forth to entertain and cater for a large crowd of spectators during the 3-day festivities. You just couldn't pass up the opportunity to enjoy this historic event!

(Note) As it happens every year, traffic jams are foreseen around the festival site, so you are requested to refrain from visiting the festival by car, bicycle, or motorcycle. Roads leading to the festival site and the parade route will be closed to cars during the 3 festive opening hours.

DISASTER PREPARATORY DRILLSunday, October 21 at Ino Junior High School

During a large disaster such as an earthquake, life lines such as gas, electricity, drinking water services might be interrupted and roads might be closed. Possible life-saving activities by disaster prevention organizations can be very limited. In such a case, it will be very important that each and every one of us cooperates each other from each standpoint. A preparatory drill allows us to prepare against damage and minimize losses by life-saving and fire fighting activities. The City of Sakura will conduct a post-disaster preparatory drill 9:00 to 12:30, Sunday, October 21 at Ino Junior High School, focusing on emergency relief/treatment activities, initial fire-fighting training, and how to operate an evacuation center. The drill will be held rain or shine, but subject to cancellation in a stormy weather. We look forward to everyone's participation. There is no parking, so please refrain from coming by a personal car.

Application for April 2013 enrolment to be accepted soon

Public kindergartens accept applications for ① 4 year-old children (born between April 2, 2008 and April 1, 2009) for 2-year education, and ② 5 year-old children (born between April 2, 2007 and April 1, 2008) for 1-year education. Application and registration will be accepted at the same time from Monday, November 5 through Friday, November 9. Please take the enrolling child with you when you make an application. During the above application period, each kindergarten provides nursing services. Make sure to bring your *in-kan* (family seal) and *juh'min-hyoh* (certificate of residence) containing information on the relationships of all family members to the householder. These certificates are available at *Shimin-ka* (the Citizens Section), City Hall.

INFLUENZA VACCINATION FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

A shot before December is highly recommended



Influenza vaccination for senior citizens is available from October 1 at medical institutions in Sakura City. To help you avoid the peak flu season, an early shot is highly recommended because it takes about two weeks for antibodies to develop in your body.

Period Monday, October 1, 2012 to Monday, December 31, 2012. (Please make an appointment with the institution in advance.)

- 1) Citizens who are 65 years of age or above. Vaccination slips were sent out to applicable persons in late September. Please fill in the slip and bring it to the medical institution.
- 2) Citizens who are 60-64 years of age and possess a "First Degree Identification Booklet for the Physically Handicapped" because of heart, kidney, or respiratory diseases. Please call Kenkoh Kanri Center to get a vaccination.

Cost 1,000 yen. (Free for citizens on welfare if a prior application is made along with presentation of a Welfare Recipient Certificate. Please apply for a Welfare Recipient Certificate to Syakai-Fukushi-ka (Social Welfare Section) in advance.
