On this first day of January 2013, I cordially wish each and every one of you a Happy New Year. I believe many of you are getting started off this New Year with a new resolution. I also have renewed my resolution to make Sakura City renowned for its richness in every aspect of life, such as natural environment, history, culture, education, community activities as well as its welfare programs. We will further disseminate this attractiveness to the people in the city and surrounding areas for revitalization of Sakura City.

Another focus of our city governance is safety and security of its citizens. We are determined to safeguard the city through disaster-prevention measures including

^{*}Monthly rent is to be determined every year based on the tenants' income and the individual housing conditions.

Eligible citizens are those who fulfill all the following conditions;

- Living in Sakura for one year or more, and have paid city taxes without delinquency
- ii) have one or more relatives to live together (however, those who are 60 years of age or above can apply without a cohabiter)
- iii) Evidently in need of housing
- iv) Meet the income criteria (under \forall 158,000/month, or under \forall 214,000/month for households with certain conditions such as aged households, disabled households, etc.)
- v) Have a cosigner who can prove regular monthly income at the same level as the applicant's or more
- vi) Neither the applicant nor the cohabiter is a gangster

START OF TEMPORARY CHILD CARE FOR CHILDREN AFTER ILLNESS



Sakura City provides temporary nursing care for infants who are not fully recovered or are in the process of recovering and are not yet allowed to go back to kindergarten or nursery schools, as long as the parents are not available to provide child care at home for unavoidable reasons, such as their jobs or ceremonial occasions. Service fee is \$2,500 per day or \$1,250 if no lunch is needed and the total service hours are less than 4 hours.

Eligible Children:

Children over 6 month old and above, as long as they are preschoolers and residing in Sakura City and/or attending kindergarten or nursery schools in Sakura City

Steps for utilization* of temporary child care for children after illness:

- 1. Get registered in the program at Sakura City Hall
- 2. Obtain a registration approval from Sakura City
- 3. Call the facility you would like to use, and make an appointment for a prior interview with the child
- 4. Visit a medical institution when the child is ill, and tell the doctor that you are using this service
- 5. Call the facility with which you interviewed in advance and make a reservation at latest the day before use. At the same time, please inform the disease name and whether or not quarantine is required
- 6. After confirming that the service can be provided by the facility, receive the "information on medical practice" from the doctor
- 7. Take an application form, letter of consent, information on medical practice, and a communication note on the day of use


EVENTS TO CELEBRATE THE NEW YEAR

♦ SHICHI-FUKUJIN STAMP RALLY 10TH ANNIVERSARY



Shichi-fukujin, which literally means "Seven Gods of Good Fortune", are said to bring wealth, happiness, and long life. The shrines/temples of the seven gods invite visitors to a Stamp Rally from January 1 through

January 10 and on the 10th day of every month, from 10:00 to 16:00. The seven shrine/temples are: Jindai-ji, Soh'en-ji, Reinan-ji, Shoh'rin-ji, Myoh'ryu-ji, Makata-jinja, and Daishoh-in. Stamping sheets for vermilion seals are available for \mathbb{Y}400 each at any of the shrine/



temples, Rekishi-seikatsu-shiryoh'kan (Center of history and folklore), or the Sakura City Kankoh Kyohkai (1-minute walk from the south exit of Keisei Sakura Station, closed between January 1 and 3). \times 200 will be required per vermilion seal to be stamped on the sheet (at Makata-jinja and Daishoh-in, \times 300 for two seals), or you can just purchase a fully stamped sheet for \times 2,000 at the Rekishi-seikatsu-shiryoh'kan. This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Stamp Rally. A limited number of special stamping sheets decorated with gold leaf are released.
