



To celebrate Children's Day (Sunday, May 5), visitors to **Buke-yashiki** on this day are offered an opportunity to put on a samurai armor costume for free. Costumes are available for both male and female, adults and children, who are 140cm tall or above. The costumes will be offered from 10:00 to 12:00 and 13:30 to 16:00 at Kyuh-Tajima-ke-juhtaku (the former residence of the Tajima samurai family). Registration on-site can be done 30 minutes before each

dressing session on a first-come, first-served basis, up to 40 people. Admission to Buke-yashiki (¥210/adult, ¥100/student) is necessary, but on the Children's Day, children up to junior high school age are offered free admission.

Common Discount Admission Ticket For The Three Cultural Architectures in Saskura

Buke-yashiki (the old samurai houses), Sakura Juntendoh Kinenkan (memorial building), and Kyu-Hotta-tei (former residence of feudal lord Hotta), are some of the most important cultural architectures in Sakura. The City offers free admission for children up to junior high school age on the Children's Day and every Saturday. You could also get discount by buying a common discount admission ticket for the three facilities as shown below. Although they are closed on Mondays usually, will be open on May 6 (national holiday) and closed on Tuesday, May 7 instead. Open hours and the usual admission fees are as shown below:

Subsidy for home solar system installation

Start of acceptance: 9:00, Friday, May 17

To promote solar power generation, Sakura City offers subsidiary to cover a part of the cost for new installation of solar power systems for residential buildings. There is a budget limitation and application is accepted on a first-come, first served basis until the budget is fully allocated.

Eligibility: Those who meet all of the following requirements are eligible for the subsidiary:

- (1) Registered residents or prospective registered residents of Sakura City who are going to install a solar power generation system to one's residence (including multipurpose houses), or who are going to purchase a ready-built house for one's residence and installing a solar power generation system to it
- (2) Those who are able to submit a performance report no later than March 19, 2014, or within 60 days after the completion of the hand-over of the residence/the solar system, whichever is earlier
- (3) Those who have paid city taxes without delay and reside in the residence until the submission of the performance report
- (4) Those who conclude a power interchange contract between an electric power company before the submission of the performance report
- (5) The generation system to be installed is brand new (Systems already installed or delivered are not eligible) and the total capacity is under 10 kilowatt

Amount of Subsidy: ¥20,000 per kilowatt of solar power generation capacity, up to 70,000 yen.

Distribution of Goya Seedlings

Seikatsu Kankyo-ka, 97 Kairinji-machi, 〒285-8501 Goya, or bitter melon, is a very popular shade-producing plant in Japan. The City distributes Goya seedlings to 200 households in Sakura (three pots per one household) by lot. Apply by sending a reply-paid postcard with your address, name, telephone number to the above address <u>no later than May 13</u> by the postmark. Winners will be notified when and where to pick them up by the return card around mid-May.

SATUKI-SAI (MAY FESTIVAL) AT KUSABUE-NO-OKA PARK

May 3 to May 6

Free admission for junior high students and younger children on May 5



'Satsuki' is a poetic name of May in the old Japanese lunar calendar. *Kodomo-no-hi* (Children's Day, May 5) is dedicated to all children, hoping for their good health and happiness. Families with sons hang up carp streamers outside their homes as a symbol, and wish for their boys to grow up as strong and brave as carps that swim upstream against the current. Warrior figures are also displayed in their homes on this day. The *Kusabue-no-oka* park, decorated with large carp streamers and brightly colored azalea blossoms, is expected to draw many visitors to the festival. The park offers variety of events and workshops such as:

The park is open from 9:00 to 17:00 daily (no admission after 16:00). Admission fee to the park, including the Rose Garden, is \$300 for children of junior high & elementary school age, \$150 for preschool children, and \$400 for others.
