The costumes will be offered from 10:00 to 12:00 and 13:30 to 16:00 at Kyuh-Tajima-ke-juhtaku (the former residence of the Tajima samurai family). Up to 40 people can enroll on-site from 30 minutes before each dressing session on a first-come, first-served basis.

Satsuki Sai (May Festival) --- Sat. May 3 to Tue. May 6

'Satsuki' is a poetic name of May in the old Japanese lunar calendar. *Kodomo-no-hi* (Children's Day, May 5) is dedicated to all children, hoping for their good health and happiness. Families with sons hang up carp streamers outside their homes as a symbol, and wish for their boys to grow up as strong and brave as carps that swim upstream against the current. Warrior figures are also displayed indoors

on this day. During the festival, many visitors are expected at *Kusabue-no-oka*, which offers variety of fun and workshops for children of elementary school age and over. You can enjoy Quiz Rally, Stilt-walking Tournament, and Water Gun Making & Playing along with the following fun activities.

City Subsidy for Improving Residents' Earthquake Resistance

Ta Kenchiku-Juhtaku-ka (Residential Construction Section, 484-6168

The importance of earthquake-proof of wooden houses is more significant than ever before now, because a major earthquake is predicted to attack Kanto area within next 30 years. Sakura City grants subsidy to its citizens for improving earthquake resistance of their residence in the following cases.

(A) Testing of wooden house's earthquake resistance level

Testing of single wooden houses inhabited by a Sakura citizen and built during the following period:

- ① On May 31, 1981 or earlier and
- ② Between June 1, 1981 and May 31, 2000

Part of the cost for quake resistance test will be covered when they meet certain requirements. Amount of the subsidy is:

- ① Two third of the testing cost calculated by the City up to a ceiling of \(\pm\)75,000
- ② Two third of the testing cost calculated by the City up to a ceiling of ¥40,000

(B) Quake resistance reinforcement work of wooden houses

Reinforcement work of single wooden houses inhabited by a Sakura citizen and built on May 31, 1981 or earlier.

Part of the cost will be covered if the work is implemented so as not to collapse after being diagnosed that there is a possibility of collapse in the event of earthquake.

Amount of the subsidy is half of the cost calculated by the City up to a ceiling of \(\frac{\pma}{5}00,000\).

(C) House renovation work of wooden houses implemented along with (B)

Amount of the subsidy is one tenth of the renovation cost calculated by the City up to a ceiling of \(\pm\)100,000.

(D) Installment of earthquake shelters and corresponding house renovation work of wooden houses For households whose members are only elderly Sakura citizens (aged 60 or over), or include at least one Sakura citizen who has a Physical Disability Certificate or Rehabilitation Certificate, and living in a single wooden house built on May 31, 1981 or earlier, part of the cost for shelter installation and corresponding house renovation will be covered.

Amount of the subsidy is the sum of the followings:

- ① Half of the shelter installation cost calculated by the City up to a ceiling of \(\frac{\pma}{1}\) 150,000
- ② One tenth of the renovation cost calculated by the City up to a ceiling of ¥100,000

*The total amount of the subsidy is limited within the budget, and the subsidy is to be given on a first come, first served basis. Please note that there may be cases satisfactory applicants cannot receive the subsidy.

 - ⇒ Obtain Boshi Kenko Techo (Maternal and Child Health Handbook) & its separate volume (vouchers for maternity checkup and health checkup for infants)
- ☑ Although this handbook is usually in Japanese, English and other 7 language versions are also available on request. The handbook is used for recording pre- and post-natal checkups, as well as keeping track of the child's vaccinations through elementary school. You must show this handbook each time you or your child gets a health check, including when you go to the hospital to give birth.

VACCINATION INFORMATION

Partial Subsidy for Mumps Vaccination

Sakura City is to subsidize part of Mumps vaccinations cost for its citizens took voluntary for children aged between 12 months and 24 months. The subsidy is paid on request and the amount is either the vaccination fees actually paid or 3,000 yen, whichever is lower, only one time during the eligible age. To receive the subsidy, please submit an application form*, vaccination certificate (or copy of its record on your Bohshi kenkoh Techoh), original copy of receipt bearing the necessary information. Application forms can be obtained at each health center or by downloading from the City's web site.
