SAKURA-NO-AKI-MATSURI



Sakura Autumn Festival 15:00 to 22:00 October 10 to October 12

Enjoy the excitement and thrill of processions made up of gorgeous floats and mikoshi!

The Sakura Autumn Festival has a long history of almost 330 years, dating back to the Edo era (the samurai period). You won't miss the expert techniques shown by the *dashi* (traditional festival floats) operators as the

floats go past each other on the narrow, twisting streets in old castle towns like Sakura. Moreover, the dynamic transfer of the *Oh-mikoshi* (great portable shrine) of Makata-Jinja Shrine is a must-see.


Please check the following dashi and mikoshi schedule.

- ◆ Fri., October 10: *Oh-mikoshi* comes out from *Makata-Jinja Shrine* at about 15:00. *Dashi* will be pulled through the town, accompanied by drum/flute music and dancing.
- ◆Sat., October 11: All the *mikoshi* and *dashi* move to the event site of the festival and will make a procession one after another along the *Shin-machi* Street.
- ◆Sun., October 12: Mikoshi and dashi will be carried around the old part of Sakura City. Oh-mikoshi returns into Makata-Jinja Shrine at about 21:40.

A lot of vendors will be setting up stalls selling food and drink, souvenirs and local merchandise, games and so forth to entertain and cater for a large crowd of spectators during the 3-day festivities. You just couldn't pass up the opportunity to enjoy this historic event!

(Note) As it happens every year, traffic jams are foreseen around the festival site, so you are requested to refrain from visiting the festival by car, bicycle, or motorcycle. Roads leading to the festival site and the parade route will be closed to cars during the three-day festive opening hours.

DISASTER PREPARATORY DRILL

Sunday, October 19 at Negoh Elementary School

Bohsai-boh'han-ka (The Disaster/Crime Prevention Section), 2484-6131



In times of disaster such as an earthquake, essential utilities including gas, electricity, drinking water services might be interrupted and roads might be closed. Possible life-saving activities by disaster prevention organizations can be very limited due to responses to multiple and simultaneous fires. It will be very important that each and every one of us prepares on a regular basis and cooperates with each other when hit by a major disaster. A preparatory drill allows us to prepare against damage and minimize losses by life-saving and fire-fighting activities. The city of Sakura will conduct a post-disaster preparatory drill as shown below focusing on emergency relief/treatment activities, training for initial fire-fighting and soup kitchen, and learning on how to operate an evacuation center. We look forward to everyone's participation.

INFLUENZA VACCINATION FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

Influenza vaccination for senior citizens is available at a reduced cost of 1,000 yen from October 1 at medical institutions in Sakura City. To protect yourself during the peak flu season, an early shot is highly recommended because it takes about two weeks for antibodies to develop in your body.

Period October 1 to December 31, 2014 (with appointment)

Location Vaccination cooperative medical institutions in Sakura City (Please make sure you call *Kenkoh Kanri Center* in advance if you are going to get a shot at institutions out of the City.)

Eligible persons

- 1) Citizens who are 65 years of age or older. Vaccination slips were sent out to applicable persons in late September. Please fill out the slip and bring it to the medical institution.
- 2) Citizens who are 60-64 years of age and possess a "First Degree Identification Booklet for the Physically Handicapped" due to heart, kidney, or respiratory diseases. Please call *Kenkoh Kanri Center* in advance.

Fee 1,000 yen. Free for citizens on welfare if Welfare Recipient Certificate is presented, which can be obtained in advance at *Shakai-Fukushi-ka* (the Social Welfare Section) of the City Hall.

VACCINATION INFORMATION

From October 1, varicella (chicken pox) vaccination for children and pneumococcal vaccination for the elderly will become one of the routine vaccinations. For target beneficiaries, vaccination slips were sent out in late September.

Varicella (chicken pox) vaccination

Target Beneficiaries	Children aged from one - under three
Vaccination Schedule	Two shots of freeze-dried live attenuated varicella vaccine (more than three months' interval required)
Transitional measure (FY2014 only)	One shot for children aged from three to under five

Pneumococcal vaccination

Target Beneficiaries	●Elderly people who become 65, 70, 75, 80, 85, 90, 95 or 100 of age or above by March 31, 2015. *Those who took the pneumococcal vaccination by September 30, 2014 are excluded. ●Those who are aged from 60 to 64 and have Physical Disability Certificate (Level 1) due to cardiac, kidney, respiratory, or HIV-associated diseases. *Vaccination slips were not sent to them. Those who wish to receive the vaccination are requested to call Kenkoh KC for checking their eligibility.	
Schedule	One shot of pneumococcal vaccine in the period from October 1, 2014 to March 31, 2015	
Fee	3,000 yen (Free for those who are living on social welfare)
