Stage Three of Mayor Warabi's Administration Started

Mayor Warabi won his third term in the election held on April 26. The following is an excerpt of his inaugural message.

At Johshi Kohen Park (Sakura Castle Park), irises in purple, pink, yellow, white and blue

are in full bloom until mid-June. At the lower garden of the Park, you can enjoy the beautiful landscape covered with some 9,000 flowers of 50 species of irises in a natural setting. Next to the iris field, you can also enjoy hydrangeas and water lilies on the water surface of the pond. During Shohbu Matsuri, you can participate in "NODATE" or open-air tea ceremony and there will be a lot of stalls to sell local products and food. Public bus service is available from Keisei Sakura station and JR Sakura station (please get off at the bus stop "Rekishi Minzoku Hakubutukan (National Museum of Japanese History)." Free parking lot is also available at the Park.

To receive Child Allowance ("Jidoh Teate"), Please Submit GENKYOH TODOKE (Current Status Report)! Dedicated Dial for Child Allowance 23 311-1115

Under Japanese child allowance system, allowance is paid to parents/guardians raising

children until the fiscal-year end (March 31) after the child turns 15 years of age. In order to receive child allowance, you need to submit *Genkyoh-Todoke* every year. In the end of May, *Genkyo-Todoke* forms for this year were sent to eligible recipients. This year, the form includes application form for *Kosodate Setai Rinji Tokurei Kyuhfukin* (Ad Hoc Special Benefit for Child Rearing Households, only for this year) for households with children. Also, a return-addressed envelope is enclosed. With this envelope, please make sure you send back the form to receive the benefits. The form must arrive no later than June 30.

Leveraging the government's subsidy, Sakura Shohkoh-kaigi-sho (Sakura Chamber of Commerce) issues Sakura Premium Shopping Coupon with 30% premium. A coupon book equivalent to

13,000 yen (1,000 yen x 13 tickets*), which is valid through December 31, is offered for 10,000 yen. 66,000 books are issued in total and sold on July 4, 5, and 6, but sales volume is limited up to 25,000 books per day on July 4 and 5, and approx. 10,000 books on July 6 (as a part of the books is preferentially sold to households with three or more children as shown below). * 3 tickets out of 13 can be used only at designated small-scale retailers.

To help the residents enjoy long and healthy life, Sakura city has sent out Medical Interview Sheets and Health Checkup Slips to the eligible persons in late May. Various health checkups and cancer

screenings are available starting this month. Please do not miss this opportunity to get checked.

- Citizens with National Health Insurance aged at 40 and above
- Citizens aged at 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 70 (both male and female) as of March 31, 2016
- Citizens who took the city's health checkup in FY2014
- Citizens eligible for the vouchers for Cancer Screening by the Japanese government
- Citizens aged at 19, 25, 30 (both male and female), 20, 35 (female only) as of March 31, 2016
- *If you took the city's medical checkup, you cannot get subsidy for Ningen Dock. For details of Ningen Dock, please call: Kyuhfu Kanri-han, 2484-6604.

Please make sure to bring your Medical Interview Sheet, Health Checkup Slip (*Kenshin-Jushin-Ken*), health insurance certificate, and checkup fee*. *: Cash payment of checkup fee will be required at the venue.

For individual examinations, the names of doctors and dentists are also listed there.


Won't you learn about water and wildlife of Imbanuma lake? Participants will observe Imbanuma lake from a houseboat, receive a lecture, and examine the water.
