# Change in the Application Period for Nursery School Entrance Next Spring

Kosodate Shien-ka (Child Rearing Support Section), #484-6245

The start of the application period for enrolling your child in a *Hoikuen* (Nursery School) for the next fiscal year will change from January to December. Also, the place of application is now limited to City Hall. Please note that applications can no longer be accepted at any nursery school. If you wish to enroll your child in a *Hoikuen* for the year from April 2018, please make sure you apply within the application periods below.

Caution: Some *Hoikuen* tends to reach full capacity within the primary application period. If that is the case, no more applications will be accepted at such *Hoikuen* during the secondary application period.

#### Application Periods:

- Primary application period: Friday, December 1 to Sunday, December 10 (including weekends)
  \*Applications for <u>current-fiscal year enrollments (January March 2018)</u> will also be accepted during this period.
- Secondary application period: Monday, February 26 to Friday, March 9 (except for weekends)
  Application Place/Time:
  - Primary application period: City Hall (Dai Kaigi-shitsu, 6th Fl., main building) Weekdays: 9:00 - 16:00 / Weekends: 9:00 - 15:00
  - > Secondary application period: City Hall (*Kosodate Shien-ka*); Weekdays only: 9:00 17:00

#### Method of Application:

For making an application, please visit City Hall with the child for whom you are applying. Make sure to bring the maternal handbook (*Boshi Techō*), health insurance certificate, your *Inkan* (family seal), your individual number (My Number) confirmation document, a fully-completed application form and all the other necessary documents shown in the 'application guidance.'

\*Application guidance leaflets are available at *Kosodate Shien-ka* in City Hall, city branch offices, and authorized nursery schools.

## Subsidies for Energy-saving Equipment in Residences

Kankyō Seisaku-ka (Environment Policy Section) 23484-6716

Installation of the following energy-saving equipment (excluding second-handed items) in a residence can be eligible for this subsidy, if the installation work started on or after April 1, 2017 and has been completed already:

- A solar power system installed in an existing house with HEMS or storage battery: ¥20,000/1KW (up to ¥90,000)
- EneFarm/Stationary-type lithium ion secondary battery: \$100,000
- Solar heat utilizing system (excluding naturalcirculation type): ¥50,000
- Ground thermal energy system: \$100,000

The application deadline is February 28, 2018. Please note that this program will end as soon as the full budget has been reached. Please call for further details.

Chiba Minimum Wage Revised Wages Section, Labor Standards Department, Chiba Labor Bureau &221-2328

Since October 1, 2017, the minimum wage per hour has been increased to  $\underline{\$868}$  in Chiba Prefecture (up  $\underline{\$26}$  from  $\underline{\$842}$ ). The minimum wage must be applied to every employee, including part-timers and temporary workers. Bonuses, family allowances, commutation allowances, and allowances for overtime, holidays and late-night work must also be paid additionally. ## Subsidies for Rain Water Storage/Permeation Equipment



Chisui-ka (Flood Control Section) 2484-4261 As part of flood control efforts, Sakura City subsidizes purchase and installment of the following equipment for rain water storage and/or permeation:

- Rain water storage tank (with 100 liters or more storage capacity), up to one (1) on the premises
- ⇒ \$100/liter of water storage capacity, or half of the installation cost, whichever is less (up to \$50,000, or else \$100,000 in the case of a septic tank being converted to a rainwater storage tank)
- Rainwater permeation basin (with an inner diameter of 25 cm or more and a depth of 50 cm or more), up to four (4) on the premises (up to ¥100,000 in total)
  Home-made: ¥2,000/basin or the cost of materials,
  - whichever is less

**Purchased:** ¥700×inner diameter (in cm)×number of basins, or else the total installation cost and purchase price, whichever is less
