In early June each year, the iris garden in Sakura Castle Site Park is filled with elegant

iris flowers in purple, yellow, white, and many other mixed colors. Visitors can enjoy the beautiful views with some 9,000 plants consisting of about 50 species of irises in a natural setting. In the Ubagaike Pond next to the iris garden, water lilies also bloom on the water surface. During Shōbu Matsuri, you can participate in "Nodate" (an open-air, paid tea ceremony) and enjoy shopping at stalls selling local products, drinks and food. A free parking area is available at *Jiyū Hiroba* next to the Park.

#### Please Submit a GENKYO TODOKE (Current Status Report) No later than June 29 to receive Jido Teate (Child Allowance) in full

Under the Japanese child allowance system, every household raising a child in Japan is eligible for financial support from the government until the first March 31st after the child's 15th birthday. In order to receive the payment, recipients need to submit a *Genkyō-Todoke* (Current Status Report) each year. In early June, *Genkyō-Todoke* forms for this year will be sent to current recipients. Please send back the form and (if you are covered by an employee pension plan or mutual aid pension plan,) a copy of your health insurance card, using the enclosed return-addressed envelope. The envelope <u>must be postmarked no later than June 29</u>. Please note: for later submission, the allowance cannot be paid for the month(s) before the submission.

# Tokutei Kenshin (specific health checkups) & Cancer Screenings (1/2)Kenkō Zōshin-ka (Health Promotion Section), \$485-6711

To help its residents enjoy long, healthy lives, Sakura City has sent out Health Checkup Slips and Medical Interview Sheets to eligible people in late May. Certain medical checkups and cancer screenings are available starting this month. Please do not miss this opportunity to maintain your

good health. Health Checkup Slips have been sent to:

- Residents covered by National Health Insurance (NHI) who are aged at least 40 years old
- Residents aged 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 65, or 70 years as of March 31, 2019
- Male and female residents aged 19, 25 or 30 years, or females aged 20 or 35 years as of March 31, 2019
- Residents who took city's health checkups in FY 2017
- Residents eligible for the vouchers for Cancer Screening offered by the Japanese government
- \* Please note that due to utility works, there will be no checkup at: ①Nambu Hoken Center during June – July (except for July 30); ②Seibu Hoken Center during October – November
- \* Those who take *Tokutei Kenshin* are not eligible for the city subsidy for *Ningen Dock*.

#### Eligibility for FREE Checkups/Screenings

- ① Those who are aged 70 years or more as of March 31, 2019
- ② Those who are covered by the Medical Insurance for Latter-Stage Elderly (Kōki-kōreisha) Healthcare System
- (3) Those who are on public assistance<sup>(\*)</sup>
- (\*)Certificate of Public Assistance Recipient is required in place of the health insurance certificate.
- ④ Those aged under 70 years who belong to a household totally exempt from city taxes

For ③ & ④, an application for a free checkup is required at latest three weeks prior to the checkup date.

Please make sure to bring your Health Checkup Slip (*Kenshin-Jushin-Ken*), Medical Interview Sheet, health insurance certificate and checkup fees\*. \* Checkup fees must be paid by cash at the venue.
