

Evacuation information in the event of a disaster

Some of the assigned titles related to the evacuation information have been revised and changed, according to the Disaster Countermeasures Basic Law and enforced on May 20 of the present year. Level 5 "Disaster Occurrence Information" has been changed to "Ensuring Emergency Safety". The previous Warning Level 4 "Evacuation Advisory" and "Evacuation order – emergency" have been unified into "Evacuation Order" and Level 3 "Preparation for Evacuation/Start of evacuation for elderly people" has been changed to "Evacuation of the Elderly". The chart below provides the recently implemented changes:

- ¾1 The city does not usually have a reliable grasp of the disaster situation so Alert Level 5 is not always issued.
- ※2 Evacuation orders will be issued at the timing of evacuation advisories.
- *3 At Alert Level 3, people other than the elderly, etc. will start suspending their usual activities as necessary and prepare for evacuation. It's the time to voluntarily evacuate if you feel in danger.

Annual Renewal of Kodomo Iryō-hi Josei Jukyū-ken

Kodomo Iryō-hi Josei Seido is a yearly program from August 1 which subsidizes out-of-pocket medical expenses for children living in Sakura City who are covered by a health insurance plan. It covers the period from right after their birth until their graduation from Junior High School.

♦ New vouchers Jukyū-ken will be sent to eligible households around July 21. If you are eligible but didn't receive the vouchers by the end of July, please let us know. Please check if there is any mistake in name or address. If there is more than one child in the household, please contact us if the children have different co-payments. Persons who made their income report and correction report after July 1, please submit notification of change as the self-pay may change.

National Health Insurance (NHI) / Medical Care for Senior Residents

The National Health Insurance card and Medical Care Certificate for senior residents will be updated. A new insurance card will be delivered by registered mail after mid-July. Please start using it from August 1st. Because of the considerable volume of cards to be delivered around the city, they might take some time to arrive, so please contact us if you have not received yours before August 1st. The NHI card will be green and the card for Senior Residents will be green too. Please note that even if there are a number of people insured for medical care for the elderly in the same household, they may not arrive at the same time.

Accepting Applications for Municipal Housing



Jūtaku-ka (Housing Section) 2 484-6168

Sakura City accepts applications for municipal housing twice a year in January and July. The next application period is <u>July 15 (Thursday) - July 30 (Friday) From 8:30 to 17:15</u> except for weekends. Application guidance will be available during this application period at the City Hall, Housing Section and at each city branch office. Distribution of application forms starts July 9th (Fri). However, please note that an application can be made only at City Hall. Applications by post are not accepted. Monthly rent will be determined every year based on each household's income and the type of individual apartment. For eligibility and other details, please call *Jūtaku-ka*.

- 2. Within the sprayed/nearby areas, please stay indoors as much as possible, and do not leave food or drinking water outside.
- 3. If you need covers for vehicles or crops, please contact the Association in advance.
- 4. Refrain from entering the paddies for about five days after the pest control is carried out.

In case there is a health related problem...>

Should you accidentally inhale or become exposed to the pesticide, immediately rinse it away by gargling and using soap. Should any symptoms such as nausea appear, please call Shokubutsu Bōeki Kyōkai, 2485-6115.
