### NAGASAKI ATOMIC BOMB EXHIBITION A STORY THAT CONVEYS THE HORRORS OF WAR

A panel exhibition on the Nagasaki atomic bomb is being held at Yume Sakura-kan until January 5 (Sun). Japan is the only country to have suffered atomic bombings during war and Nagasaki is the last place in the world to have been hit by an atomic bomb. The photographs from that time remind us of the tragedies that war has brought to our lives and the horror of nuclear weapons.

Sakura City is implementing various peace projects based on the "Sakura City Peace Administration Basic Ordenance" enacted in 1995 and the "Peace City Declaration" of the same year. Next year will mark the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the end of the war. Let's reflect on the horrors of war and the value of peace!

## NAGASAKI SOUL FOOD AT SAKURA CITY HALL CAFETERIA

To help people learn about the history of Nagasaki and Sakura, the City Hall Cafeteria will be holding a "Nagasaki Fair" from January 8 (Wed) to January 31 (Fri) where Nagasaki soul foods "Toruko Rice"

and "Hatoshi" will be served in traditional Nagasaki ceramic "Hasami ware". A hearty Toruko rice dish with pasta, pilaf and a chicken cutlet are served on a plate. And there is Hatoshi, which is shrimp paste sandwiched between slices of bread and deep-fried, both beloved dishes in Nagasaki. Be sure to give them a try on this occasion. During the event, panels explaining the connection between Nagasaki and Sakura will also be on display, so while you enjoy your meal, you can think back to Nagasaki, which has a deep connection

- Tezukuri Kōbō Sakura will start New Year operations on Jan. 4 (Sat) from 10:00 ~ 17:00. X Closed on Mondays as well as the first and third Tuesdays of every month.
- Ichioka Japanese sweets parlor will open from Jan. 1 (Wed/Holiday) until Jan. 10 (Fri) from 10:00 ~ 16:00. Will close on Jan. 11 (Sat). Closed on Sundays and public holidays.
- Sakura City Tourism Association. Closed from Jan. 1 (Wed., holiday) to Jan. 3 (Fri., holiday).

## Vermillion stamps' fees for each temple and shrine.

One stamp of a vermillion seal costs 200 yen (300 yen for the two stamps of *Makata Jinja Shrine* and *Daishōin*). You can obtain them from Jan. 1 (Wed., holiday) to Jan. 10 (Fri.) and on the 10<sup>th</sup> of every month from 10:00  $\sim$  16:00)

※Daishōin no Daikokuten and Shorinji no Bishamonten are hidden Buddhas and cannot be viewed.

♦ On special collection days, items may be collected at different times than usual.

Oversized garbage collection reservation starts from January 6<sup>th</sup>, (Mon). Please call the facility that corresponds to the area where you live. X The telephone lines may be busy during the New Year period.

A fee of 350 yen is charged for every 10 kg. of garbage. Please note that the fee will be charged even if you are using the city's designated bags.

#### **ROUTINE INFLUENZA VACCINATIONS**

The vaccination period for regular influenza vaccinations is until the end of January.

Fee: 1,500 Yen. Target people: Those aged 65 years old or older whose birthday is before January 1, 1960. Those aged 60~64 years old with a first-class disability certificate for heart, kidney, respiratory conditions etc. Deadline: For both, within and outside the city, until January 31

(Fri). The period for vaccinations outside the city has been extended until January 31, 2025. Xvaccinations outside this period



are not covered by public funds.
