SAKURA CITY PROVIDES SCHOOL LUNCHES AT ALL ELEMENTARY AND JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS!

One of the joys of school life for children is school lunches. Sakura City has implemented a "school-style school lunch" system in which nutrition teachers and nutritionists assigned to each school create menus and provide unique school lunches at all Elementary and Junior High Schools in the city. In addition to being able to provide hot and delicious meals quickly, the school's own school lunches also contribute greatly to the growth of the children in Sakura City.

THE APPEAL OF SAKURA CITY'S SCHOOL LUNCHES!

School lunch programs began in earnest in 1954 with the enactment of the School Lunch Act. At that time, the main purpose of school lunches was to provide nutrition, but in recent years, due to the diversification of our lifestyles, the environment surrounding food has changed significantly. In this context, it is recognized that food plays an important role in fostering children's rich humanity and equipping them with the power to live.

As a result, school lunches are now viewed not only as a means of nutritional supplementation but also as an opportunity for food education or "shokuiku" which relates to teaching children about food.

In Sakura City's self-managed school lunches, nutritionists, who are regularly assigned to each Elementary and Junior High Schools, are in charge of designing the lunch menus. Since nutritionists are familiar figures to the children and arrange the ingredients with knowledge of their backgrounds, it becomes easier to implement practical food education related to the meals.

The schools utilize the natural blessings of Sakura in school lunches:

Since each school arranges its own ingredients, it is easier to use locally produced ingredients from nearby farms, which contributes to providing safe and reliable lunches. Additionally, nutritionists at each school can directly communicate the importance of food to the children.



FOOD EDUCATION THROUGH DISTINCTIVE SCHOOL LUNCHES.

Did you know that it was Tsuda Sen, an agricultural scholar from the former Sakura Domain, who introduced western vegetables like broccoli and asparagus to Japan? In schools within the city, on or around April 24th, which is the anniversary of his death, a special school lunch called "Tsuda Sen Kyūshoku" is offered, featuring a menu centered on the western vegetables that Sen helped popularize.

In addition, there is the "Clara Menu" (held every December), named after Clara Whitney, who, upon receiving Tsuda's consultation on spreading western vegetables, published a cookbook called "Easy Western Cooking".

★ At Nego Elementary School, a special menu called "Tsuda Sen school lunch" created by the students based on what they learned about Tsuda Sen, was provided. The menu of the day included "Sen's vegetable gratin" made with western vegetables and "strawberry panna cotta". In fact, Tsuda Sen was also the first to successfully cultivate strawberries in Japan!

Food education is not only for children. Acquiring knowledge about food, learning to make informed food choices and discovering local attractions and culture through food are essential skills for all generations. For more details on the city's food education initiatives, please







TEMPORARY BENEFITS AGAINST RISING PRICES FOR HOUSEHOLDS EXEMPT FROM RESIDENT TAX



In light of the increased burden caused by rising prices, the city will provide grants to households that are exempt from resident tax and are feeling the greatest hardship.

• Additional payment for households not subject to resident tax in fiscal year 2024.

Benefit amount: 30,000 Yen per household.

Target: Heads of households who are registered as residents in the city as of December 13, 2024 and whose members are exempt from resident tax for 2024.

< Households not eligible for the payment >

- ♦Those that are exempt from resident tax in 2024 and that have received support from other municipalities similar to Sakura City's 30,000 Yen grant or that include a former head of the household.
- ♦Dependents of those who are subject to resident tax.
- ♦Those who qualify for tax exemption under a tax treaty.

< Procedure method >

Olf you are the head of a household eligible for the benefit, have a government-registered account for receiving public funds or an account in your name that received the previous benefit and meet certain requirements, a "Payment Notice" was sent by the end of January.

②For other heads of households who are deemed eligible for payment, a "Payment Requirements Confirmation Form" may have been sent by the end of February. Please fill out the required information, attach the necessary documents and submit them. *There are cases where an application is required regardless of whether or not a confirmation letter was sent.

APPLICATIONS FOR THE FY 2024 SHORT-TERM HEALTH AND BRAIN CHECKUPS SUBSIDIES (NINGEN DOCK AND NŌ DOCK) WILL CLOSE ON **MARCH 31 (MONDAY)**

Target: Those who are insured under Sakura City's National Health Insurance (20 years of age or older) or those who are insured under Sakura City's Medical Care for the Elderly and who went through the following checkups between April 1, 2024 ~ March 31, 2025:

♦Short-term Health Checkup:

Those who are undergoing a short-term health checkup that includes specified items (equivalent to a specific medical checkup 「Tokutei Kenshin」). ※Those who had their specific health checkup conducted in fiscal year 2024 are not eligible.

♦Brain checkup:

Those who have received the FY2024 short-term health checkup subsidy (including those who undergo a shortterm health checkup at the same time as a brain checkup) or those who have undergone a specific health checkup implemented in FY 2024 and are undergoing a brain checkup including a head MRI and a head MRA.

The subsidy amount is within one-half of the examination fees:

For the short-term health checkup up to 15,000 Yen. For the brain checkup, up to 10,000 Yen.

Additional child allowance for households exempt from residence tax in fiscal year 2024.

Additional amount: 20,000 per eligible child.

Target: Heads of households with children under the age of 18 (born after April 2, 2006 as of December 13, 2024).

< Procedure method >

As a general rule, the additional child allowance amount is included in the "Payment Notice" or "Payment Requirements Confirmation Form" indicated in **o** on the left.

< Special exceptions >

- ※Households that fall under item

 and have children who fall under any of the following categories can also be eligible for item 2 upon application.
- ♦ Children under 18 years of age (born after April 2, 2006) who are not living in the same household as the applicant but share the same livelihood as the head of the household on the reference date.
- ♦ Children born on or after December 14, 2024.
