SAKURA, A TOWN WE LOVE! LET'S PRESERVE ITS SCENERY FOR GENERATIONS TO COME!

The landscape is the "face" of the town.

A landscape is not just the scenery and atmosphere of a town; it also reflects the impression it gives to those who see it, as well as nature, history, culture and lifestyles. The city is working to develop a landscape that is unique to Sakura and pass it on to future generations, including formulating the "Sakura City Landscape Plan", so that residents and visitors will find the town attractive.

The "Sakura City Landscape Plan" aims to protect the landscape in Sakura city.

This plan determines directions for further development based on the characteristics and issues of Sakura City's landscape.

Through this plan, the city is carrying out various activities, such as providing advice on creating local landscapes, in order to protect and utilize the "Sakura-like landscape" formed by the rich history and culture found throughout the city and the abundant nature.

What is a typical Sakura landscape? Introducing the city's "landscape hubs".

Sakura city has many distinctive landscapes, such as the old castle town and the view of Imbanuma Lake. In the Sakura City Landscape Plan, areas where these local scenic resources are concentrated or places with symbolic elements representing the character of Sakura city are designated as "landscape hubs" and special efforts are made to preserve them. Some of them are:

Nature / rural landscape hubs >

We are committed to preserving waterside, rural areas, countryside and valleys as "hometown landscapes" for the long term.

Imbanuma Lake waterfront scenic hubs -> The wide water surface of Imbanuma lake and the surrounding rural scenery create a bright and open, unique landscape, which can be said to be a symbol of Sakurá.









←Historic landscape hubs We have preserved the historic buildings that remain in the area, which create nostalgic and charming landscapes. These are also used as learning centers and will be passed to future generations as important community

Utilizing the commercial facilities that gather around each train station and station plazas, lively and bustling landscapes are emerging, serving as appropriate gateways to each region.

In areas such as the the samurai residences (around Miyakoji-cho) and the merchants districts (from Shinmachi to Honmachi areas) a charming townscape unfolds, one where the traditional architecture coexists harmoniously with the greenery of the surrounding slopes. We will protect natural and historical resources and create a landscape that reflects the inherited culture.

As of April 2024, there are 254 neighborhood associations in Sakura City, with 51,666 households affiliated with these associations. This means that 64.3% of all households in Sakura City are members of the neighborhood association. However, the number of members of neighborhood associations has been declining due to lifestyle changes and other reasons. Increasing community activities will strengthen ties within the community,

fostering relationships that allow people to support each other on a daily basis and increase the sense of security in times of emergency such as disasters. These effects will be further enhanced by increasing the rate of membership in community associations.

Bone Marrow Transplant subsidy system

•Information on the subsidy system for bone marrow donors:

Sakura City provides subsidies to donors and the businesses where donors work, with the aim of increasing the number of bone marrow and peripheral blood stem cell donors and promoting transplants.

Subsidy target:

- ► Those who live in the city and have donated bone marrow, etc. through the bone marrow donation program run by the Japan Marrow Donation Foundation (or who have given final consent to donate bone marrow, etc. but whose donation was cancelled).
- ► The donor's workplace has granted the donor "donor leave (special leave taken for hospitalization for tests required for donating bone marrow, etc.)"

•Subsidy amount:

Depending on the number of days spent visiting hospitals and the number of days of donor leave given.

- → Donor: 20,000 Yen per day. (Up to a maximum of 140,000 Yen per bone marrow donation.
- → Businesses: 10,000 Yen per day (Up to a maximum of 70,000 Yen per donor).

To apply, you will need a certificate issued by the Japan Marrow Donor Program (A public interest incorporated foundation).
